



Alaska Sea Kayaking Adventure in the West Arm of Glacier Bay National Park

Join Spirit Walker Expeditions on 4-days and 3-nights of sea kayaking and camping in Glacier Bay National Park - renowned for its tidewater glaciers; luminous icebergs; an abundance of wildlife including brown and black bears, mountain goats, humpback whales, sea otters, and Stellar sea lions; as well as an opportunity to follow in the adventurous footsteps of John Muir in search of wilderness and solitude.



*This is a sample itinerary. Daily activities may vary due to factors which can include changing weather, tides, ocean conditions and wildlife.



A 4-day/3-night camping adventure in Glacier Bay starting and ending in Gustavus, Alaska. Suitable for all paddling levels and all ages.

Day 1: Arrive in Gustavus (Alaska Airlines flight from Seattle arrives daily at 5pm). Pre-trip orientation with your Spirit Walker guides. Lodging of your own choice.

Day 2: Begin the sea kayaking expedition with a 60 mile private water taxi ride from Bartlett Cove to our first campsite in the West Arm of beautiful Glacier Bay. Set up camp and explore the surrounding area by kayak. Paddling distance: 3-6 miles.

Day 3: A full day of exploring and looking for wildlife by kayak and by foot. Camp. Paddling distance: 6-9 miles.

Day 4: Pack up camp and explore the coast line as we paddle south to our next campsite. Paddling distance: 7-9 miles

Day 5: Morning spent enjoying the wilderness by kayak as we paddle the short distance to our pick up spot. Paddling distance: 1-3 miles. Pick up by the National Park's Tour Boat. Return to Bartlett Cove by 3pm. (Alaska Airlines flight leaves to Seattle daily at 6pm) Or stay the night and take the opportunity to explore Gustavus and the Huna Tribal House in Glacier Bay National Park. Lodging of your own choice.



4-Day/3-Night Kayaking Trip: \$2099/person

The cost of the kayaking trip includes experienced and professional guides, water taxi and day boat transportation, 2 person kayaks with paddling/safety accessories; emergency communication and first aid equipment; tents, sleeping bags/pads, 3 excellent meals a day plus snacks, rain gear, rubber boots and dry bags.

*The cost does not include airfare to and from Gustavus, lodging before and after trip, a 3% Gustavus sales tax, or gratuities.

* The National Park Service, Department of Interior, authorizes Spirit Walker Expeditions as a Concessioner to provide Guided Overnight Kayaking Services within Glacier Bay National Park and Preserve.

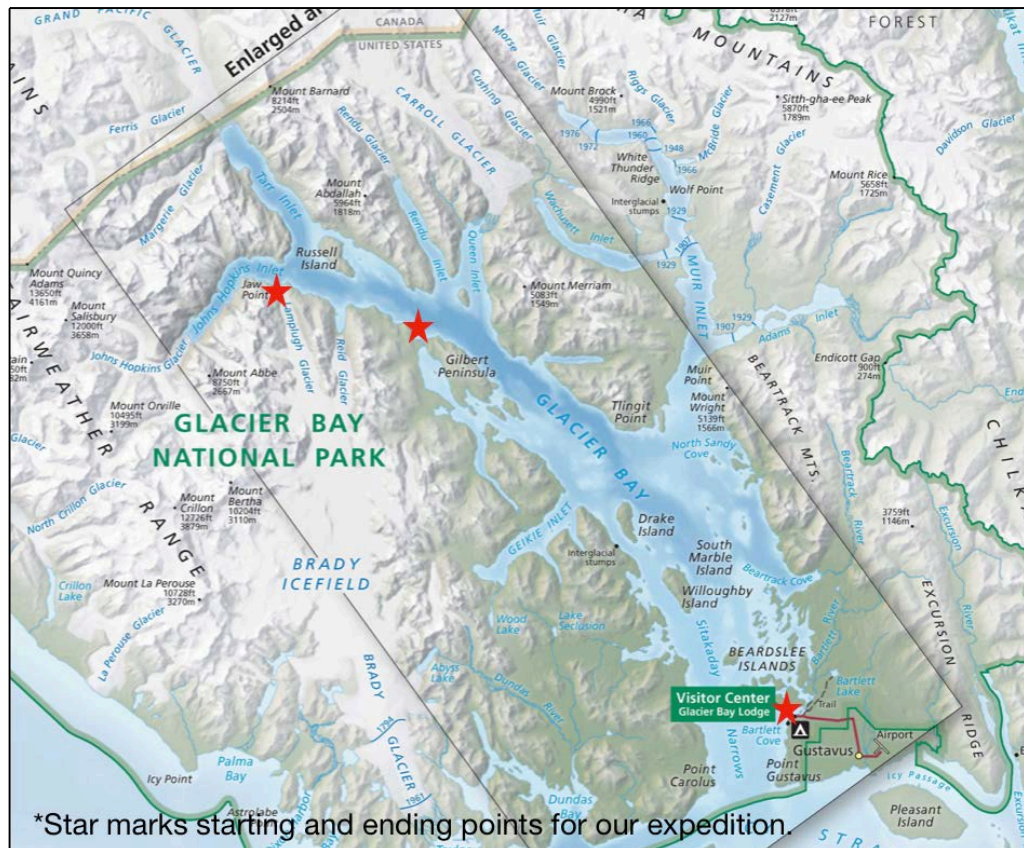

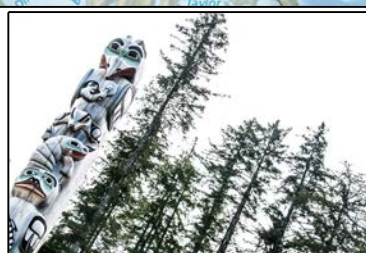
